

Speaking and Listening / Grammar / Reading and Writing

In English, we will start by looking the story of Pompeii, reading about exciting adventures. Children will then write their own stories based on their interests in the Ancient Greek culture.

We will then look at producing what we have discovered about Pompeii and producing this as a newspaper report.

Later on be diaries written in the Roman times, investigating the lives and experiences of different people and their roles. Children will write their diaries learning about the many different aspects of their lives.

History and Geography

In history, children will investigate the ancient civilisation of Rome. They will investigate this fascinating part of history by looking at their religion, civilisation and family life. This will include differences between education, the rich and the poor and other such factors. Children will look at secondary sources of evidence such as books, the Internet and historical reports. We will focus especially on the events in Pompeii.

We will also look at human geography, including types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water.

Mathematical Development

In maths we will be concentrating on various aspects of number as such Area, multiplication, division and fractions. We will look at mastery problems and challenges in order to extend our thinking. In addition to this, we will continue to practise operations (add, subtract, multiply and divide) and continue to enjoy challenging ourselves with the Times Table Rock Stars computer program and 3-minute challenges.

Home Learning

The children will have the chance to complete some homework regarding aspects of our topic.
