School Lunches

Our school lunches are very popular. When on the lunchtime rota, to go to the dining room, your child has a choice of:

- hot dinner
- hot vegetarian dinner
- jacket potato with a choice of filling
- sandwich with a choice of filling and a selection of desserts.

Your child needs to choose at the start of the school day and order at registration. A copy of the menus can be found on our school website.

For Year 3, 4 and 5 pupils, school meals must be paid for in advance through **Parent Pay**. The cost of a school meal is £2.30 per day (£11.50 each week). If you have any questions about school lunches, or paying for these please contact Mrs Ford. The school office can also support with your application for Free School Meals.

School Milk

Some of you may not be aware of the entitlement you may have to free school meals (NOT universal free school meals in Year 1 or 2); this will also mean that your child gets free milk in school. If parents of Y1-6 pupils want their child to have milk, then please ask at the school office for a form.

Attendance and Punctuality

Our doors open at 8.30 am and close promptly at 8.45 am. If your child arrives after 8.45am they will receive a late mark and need to come though the main reception where a member of our Pastoral Team will meet them.

The target attendance figure for all pupils is a **minimum of 96.1%** attendance. Based on their attendance figures your child will be placed in one of the following groups below:
